

Plainfield Township Friendship Gardens

2017 GUIDELINES

Garden Plot Information and Identification

Garden plots are located on the east side of the township building. Four corner stakes mark each plot and plots are identified with a numbered wooden stake. **PLEASE DO NOT REMOVE YOUR STAKES!** Plot sizes are approximately 15' x 30' and 15' x 20' and cost the following:

15' x 30' (Plots 1-36)

Township Senior Residents (age 60)	\$20.00
Non- Township Senior Residents	\$30.00
Township Residents	\$25.00
Non-Township Residents	\$35.00

15' x 20' (Plots 38-45)

Township Senior Residents (age 60)	\$15.00
Non- Township Senior Residents	\$25.00
Township Residents	\$20.00
Non-Township Residents	\$30.00

Gardeners Responsibilities

- Before planting, check the plot number to be certain you are planting on the correct plot. If you are unsure of your assigned plot number, call the Township before planting. (*The Township is not responsible for costs incurred in replanting*).
- Gardeners should maintain each plot to its boundaries; from corner to corner. The Township will take care of areas surrounding the plots.
- Garden hoses are permitted. Please be courteous of other gardeners and their plots.
- Gardeners are expected to weed their plots and keep them neat. If weeds grow beyond 12" in height, the Township has the right to mow the entire plot. In such cases, a warning will be issued either by Email or phone. Gardeners will then have one week to weed before the plot is mowed.
- Plastic bags, rocks, string, or plant material should not be left in the garden aisles. These objects can be dangerous and destructive. It is the responsibility of each gardener to remove these items.
- Parking is available in the circular parking area closest to the gardens. Please do not park on the grass.
- Please be courteous to all other gardeners and respect their boundaries.
- The Township will not be responsible for theft, damage, vandalism or any other acts of destruction or loss as well as makes no guarantees for water drainage, growth or drought.
- If you have extra produce, you may consider donating it to the Plainfield Township Interfaith Food Pantry located in the Assistance Center off the main building. The foyer is always open to leave donated produce.
